# **Phonics and Reading**



Following our little wandle phonics scheme, we will be learning phonics everyday reviewing our phase two sounds from reception and progressing to our new year one sounds. The children will be continuing to blend, segment and read words.

We would love to hear about books you and your child have read and enjoyed at home so please continue to read at home.

Recommended reads:

We are focussing on picture books this term. Children always enjoy stories written by Julia Donaldson. Some favourites are the smartest giant in town, room on the broom and Zog. Some more favourites by different authors include Elmer by David McKee, and Aliens love underpants by Claire Freedman and Ben Cort.

### Writing



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In the first part of the Autumn Term, we are going to be looking at some stories and some visual literacy film clips. For the book units we will be looking at Pumpkin Soup by Helen Cooper, What the Ladybird Heard by Julia Donaldson and the short film bubbles.

We are going to be focusing on building sentences, with a key emphasis on using punctuation such as full stops and capital letters. We will also be looking at the use of descriptive language such as adjectives to expand our sentences.

Kinetic letters handwriting be a key focus; incorporating correct pencil grip, starting and finishing points and correct letter formation.

#### Maths

This terms units will include addition and subtraction and place value.

The children will learn to represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 10. To read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs. The children will add and subtract one-digit numbers to 10 and solve one step problems using the mathematical signs using concrete objects and pictorial representations.

#### Science

During science, the children will be learning about a variety of familiar and less familiar animals, including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals. We will be introducing the children to the term's 'carnivore', 'herbivore' and 'omnivore'. You could begin prompting your child to think about pets that may live with them and how these might be looked after if they need to visit a vet for treatment.

#### Computing

The children will develop their ability to log on to the sites we use in school, and be shown how to access these with websites and log-ins to use at home. The first unit of work is called online safety and exploring purple mash. Alongside this we will also look at grouping and sorting.



# **Design & Technology**

Structures – Constructing Windmills

The children will be using everyday materials to construct a windmill, children will work Together to build a functioning windmill, they will need to think about the mechanism and how stable their windmill needs to be.



### Geography

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Our Geography unit this term is called 'Here I am!'. The Children will be taught to how to use a map and locate the features of the local area. We will also be looking at the physical features around as such as hill, forest and river. We will also be looking at the human features around us such as shops and houses. The children will be learning about the three different types of settlements: village, town and city.

#### Music

Our unit for this term is called 'Hey you!'. The children will be listening and appraising a range of hip hop songs and comparing what similiarities and differences the songs have.

Pupils will be listening for the different dimensions of music such as pitch, tempo, beat and rhythm. They will also be identifying what musical instruments and vocals can be heard. Each week, the children will build up to a class performance of the song where they will use instruments, vocals and actions.

# PE – Monday and Wednesday

Children will have two separate lessons during the week. This will include outdoor adventurous activities and football. We will be working hard to develop our key skills in both elements, working both individually and part of a team.


